

CEO and designated corporate officer for employee issue of Flughafen Munchen GmbH

Dr. Michael Kerkloh (64) started in September 2002 acquiring the helm of FMG the Munich Airport operating company, as President and CEO. Under his leadership, Bavaria's gateway to the world has moved up to join the ranks of Europe's top air transportation hubs, with annual traffic exceeding 44 million passengers in 2017. Dr Kerkloh has very successfully promoted a strategic partnership with Lufthansa German Airlines and in a unique joint venture both airport and airline have built terminal 2 and a state-of the art satellite to serve the growing demand of air traffic in Munich. Munich Airport has not only been chosen by travelers as Europe's best but was also appointed Europe's first "5-star-Airport"

Kerkloh graduated in Economics at the University of Frankfurt and completed a doctorate in Political Science. He started his career in aviation at Frankfurt airport and was later appointed managing director of Hamburg airport. From 2013 until 2016 he was president of the German Airports Association (ADV). Being a Board Member of Airport Council International (ACI) in both. World and Europe, he was elected as president of ACI Europe in 2017 He now represents the Interests of more than 500 airports in 45 European countries.



Dr. CHUNG Il-Young

President & CEO Incheon International Airport Corporation

Dr. CHUNG Il-Young was born on 14 August 1957. He received a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Yonsei University in 1980. In 1988, he received a master's degree in Development Economics from Oxford University, and in 1997, a Ph.D in Economics from LEEDS University, UK.

He took office as the 7th CEO of Incheon International Airport Corporation in February 2016. Prior to nomination, he has served as the CEO of Korea Transportation Safety Authority, where his committed leadership led to the highest revenue since the organization's opening, and a sharp decrease in casualties caused by traffic accidents.

He is also an expert for aviation, having served in the MOLIT (Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, and Transportation) of the central government of ROK, notably as the Deputy Minister for Office of Transportation Policy, Deputy Minister for Office of Civil Aviation, and the Head of Civil Aviation Safety Authority. He has played a key role not only in the successful opening, planning, and management of Incheon Airport, but in world aviation safety for 20 years. He also worked as Councillor, Korean Mission to UN, International Civil Aviation Organization.





Mr. Makoto Natsume

President & CEO Narita International Airport Corporation (NAA)

Mr. Natsume was appointed as President & CEO of Narita International Airport Corporation (NAA) on 27 June 2012. Before joining NAA, Mr. Natsume served in a core management position at East Japan Railway Company (JR East).

After graduating from the faculty of law, Tokyo University, he joined Japan National Railways in July 1971. Since then, Mr. Natsume has demonstrated a track record of accomplishment with his involvement in the successful privatization and partition of Japan National Railways in 1987. In the subsequent 18 years after privatization, he served in key management positions in corporate management, investment planning and subsidiary company management, applying his wealth of executive management skills to bear on the establishment of the corporate fundamentals of the JR East group. He served as Senior Executive Vice President of JR East between June 2003 and June 2005.

In June 2005, Mr. Natsume was appointed as President and CEO of JR East Retail Net Co., Ltd. where he made a major contribution to the successful growth and development of the company's retailing business at railway stations.


Mr. Ho Chee Tong


Mr. Le Manh Hung






Mr. Luc Partoune
